

Overview

- · World-wide non-profit consortium formed in 1988 to establish, maintain and endorse a standardized set of relevant benchmarks
- Development of benchmark suites, review and publication of results
- · 100 computer hardware and software vendors, educational and research institutions, and government agencies
- Large repository of well documented, peer reviewed, benchmark results
- · Understanding of workloads, benchmark code, fair comparisons across different systems
- · Provide guidance on workloads and benchmark development

Philosophy

- Ensure that the marketplace has a fair and useful set of metrics to differentiate systems
- Provide standardized code ported to a wide variety of platforms, metrics that are relevant and comparable across systems, and run rules to ensure representative and repeatable tests

Advantages

- · Costs of benchmarking are kept down since:
 - · Benchmarks are applicable to a broad range of platforms
 - · A single standard benchmark replaces dozens of single use custom benchmarks
 - · Peer review saves time and money over 3rd party audits
- Benchmarks are retired and replaced every 3-5 years to keep pace with technology
- New benchmarks can be created whenever there is sufficient interest
